



Prince's Golf Club - Local Rules

The following Local Rules will apply to all golf played at Prince's Golf Club. In addition, there may be Temporary Local Rules in place, which will be posted on the noticeboard.

Out of Bounds (Rule 18.2)

- Beyond any wall, fence or white stakes defining the boundary of the course.

Shore

- Over the fence to the left of the 1st and 2nd Shore.
- The Lodge and Putting Green to the left of the 6th Shore as defined by white stakes.
- Beyond the fence at the back of the 6th Shore.

Dunes

- To the right of the 3rd Dunes as defined by white stakes.
- Beyond the fence at the back of the 5th Dunes.

Himalayas

- To the left of the green at the 1st Himalayas as defined by white stakes.
- Beyond the fence at the back of the 5th Himalayas.
- Over the fence to the left of the 6th and 7th Himalayas.
- The Clubhouse, car park and surrounds as defined by white stakes.

Penalty Areas (Rule 17)

- All Penalty Areas are marked as Red Penalty Areas with red stakes.

Abnormal Course Conditions (Rule 16)

Ground Under Repair

- All GUR areas are No Play Zones and will be marked by white lines and/or signs. Relief is mandatory.

Immovable Obstructions

- All artificially surfaced roads and paths, including the rough track crossing the 3rd and 8th Shore, and 4th and 7th Dunes.
- All wooden sleepers including sleepered bunker faces and wooden steps leading into bunkers - these are not in the bunker.
- Fixed sprinkler heads on the line of play for a ball in the General Area - if the obstruction is within two club-lengths of the putting green, and within two club-lengths of the ball and both the ball and obstruction are in areas cut to fairway height or less.

Integral Objects (The ball must be played as it lies or dropped under the Rules)

- All natural paths.

Sand Scrapes

- All sand scrapes on the course are part of the General Area and are not bunkers. The club may be grounded in these areas but there is no free relief for an embedded ball.

Wrong Greens (Rule 13.1f)

- Relief must be taken if a ball comes to rest on a wrong putting green or if that wrong putting green interferes with their stance or area of intended swing. The relief area also extends to an area of fairway/apron within two club-lengths from the edge of the wrong putting green.
